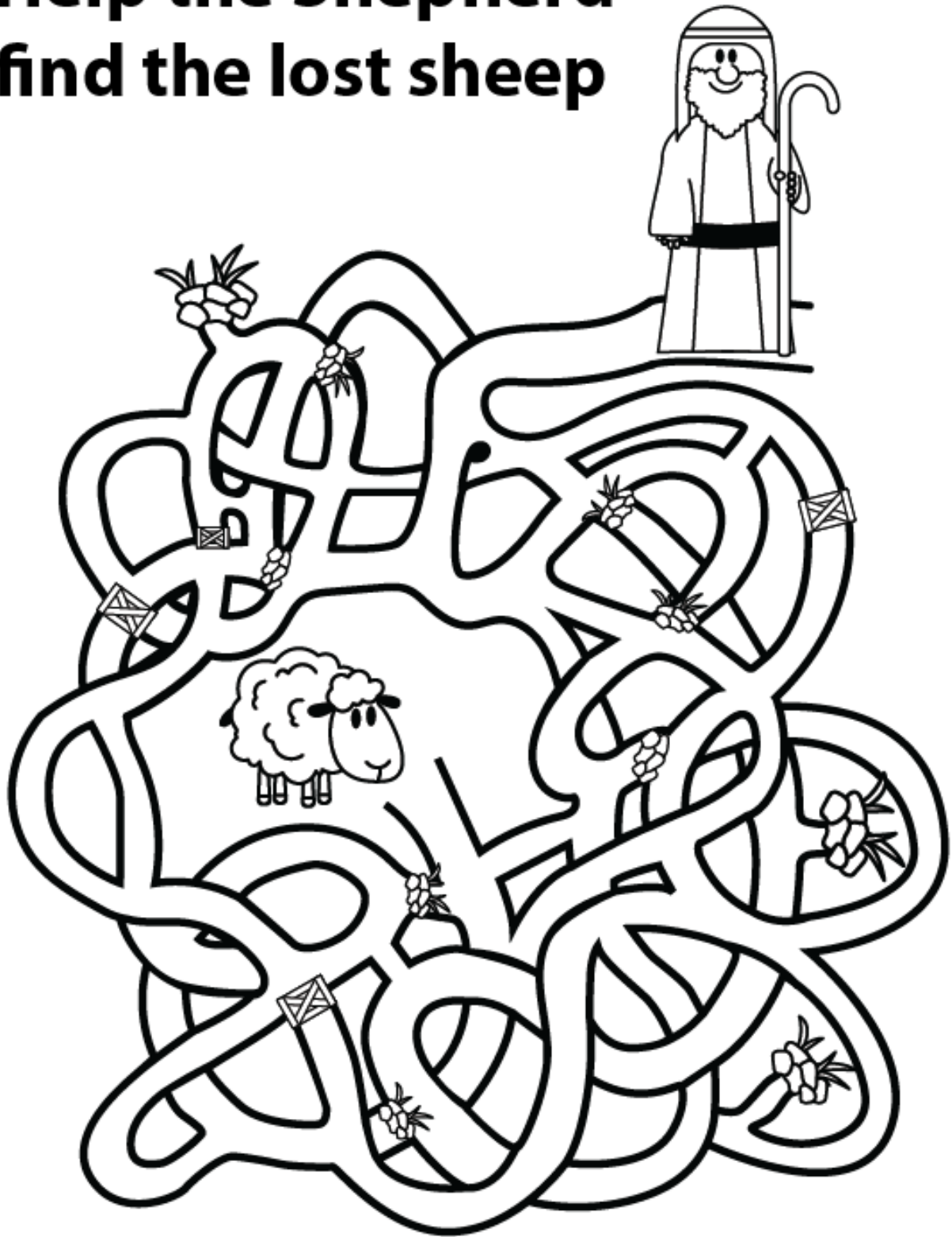

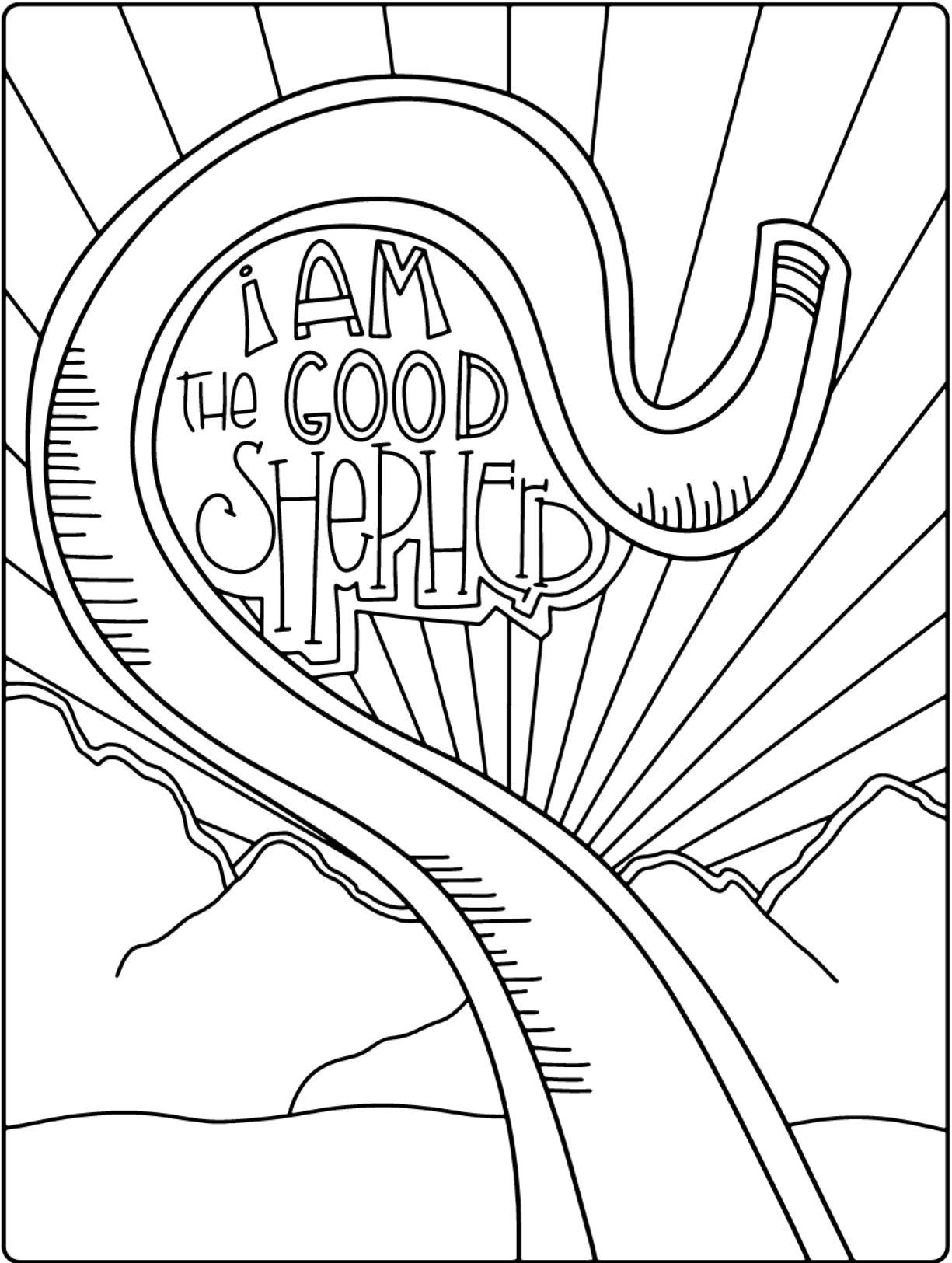

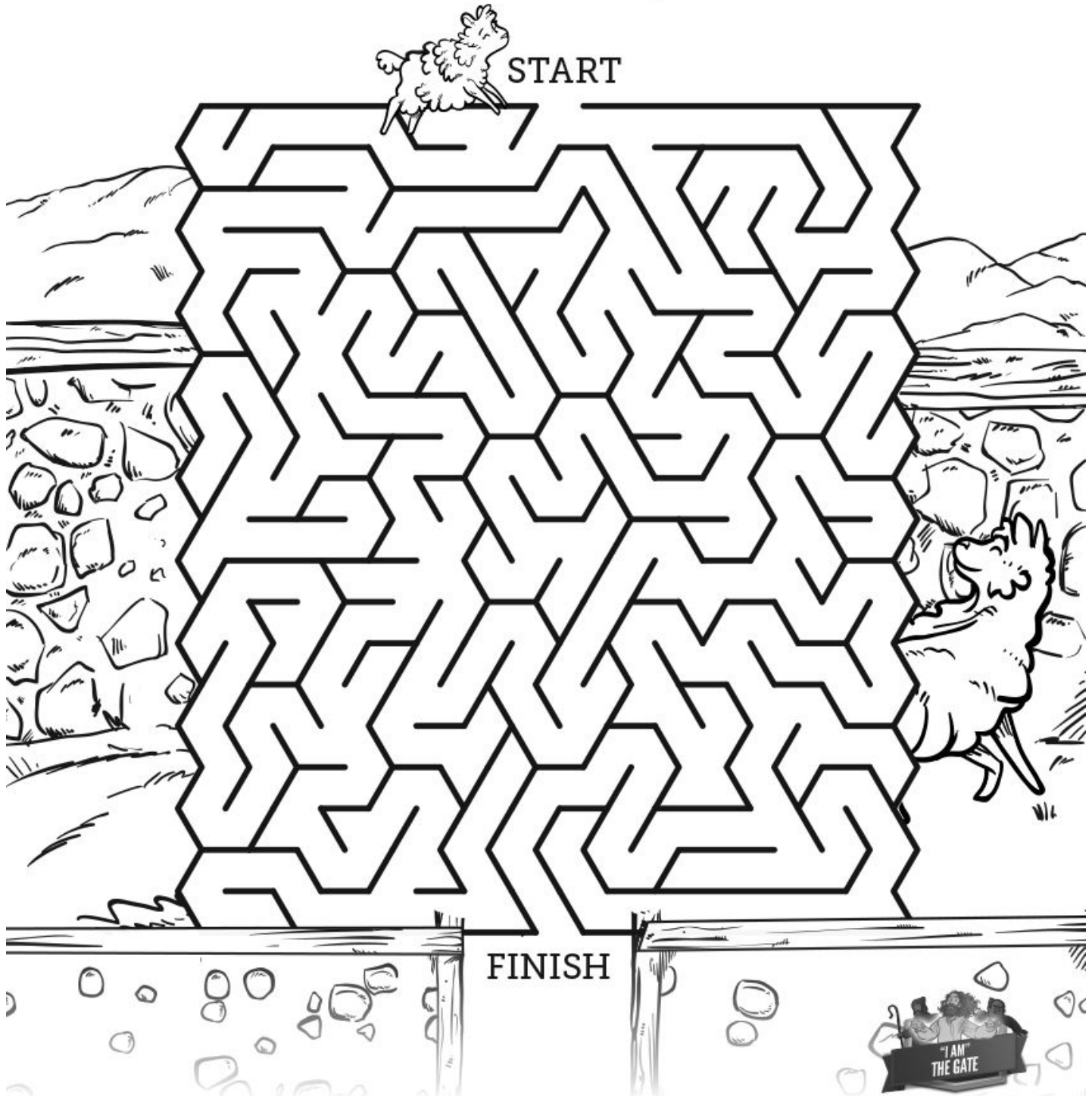

Guide the sheep to the Shepherd's Gate.

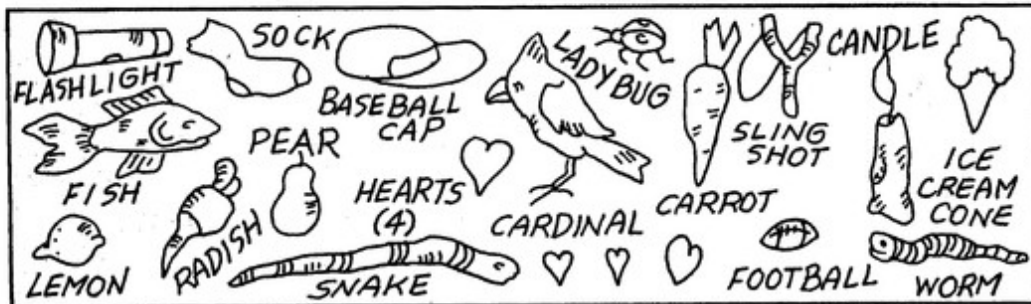
